Barbara L. Jones, the Museum's first Curator, joined The Westmoreland Museum of American Art in October 1995, was promoted to Chief Curator in 2009, and retired after 26  $\frac{1}{2}$  years on April 1, 2022.

As a member of the Senior Management team, she had overall responsibility for the Museum's permanent collection and exhibitions. With a concentration in the primary fields of nineteenth and twentieth century American art, she holds Masters degrees in both Art History and Museum Studies from Syracuse University and has a record of published research in American and regional art.

Publications in conjunction with exhibitions include Nature Staged: The Landscape and Still Life Paintings of Levi Wells Prentice (1993); Samuel Rosenberg: Portrait of a Painter, in cooperation with Carnegie Museum of Art (2003); Born of Fire: The Valley of Work, on the Museum's scenes of industry collection (2006); and Painting in the United States (2008). Picturing America: Signature Works from the Westmoreland Museum of American Art (2010) was published to accompany the reinstallation of the permanent collection galleries that year.

She contributed to the catalogue and co-curated the exhibition Simple Pleasures: The Art of Doris Lee that opened in September 2021 and is traveling to three venues. A member of American Alliance of Museums and the Association of Art Museum Curators, she juries both national and regional art exhibitions and has lectured widely.

With an exceptional museum team, she completed the redesign and reinstallation of all the renovated and expanded galleries of The New Westmoreland in 2015. She served as a member and Chair of the Historic Architectural Review Board for the City of Greensburg from 2007-2019 and has recently joined the Steering Committee for the Westmoreland Land Trust's Carl A. Schwarz Memorial Nature and Art Park.



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### JUROR STATEMENT

It was an honor to jury the SPCARTS 27th Annual Exhibition, although my task was not easy: I was charged with winnowing 242 submissions to a lean group of just under 70 acceptances. Open call exhibitions offer diversity and breadth: I was delighted by the range of media, visual strategies, techniques, and subject matter that I reviewed. I gravitated towards unusual perspectives. While it is pleasant, for example, to look at a skillfully depicted landscape painting, I embrace the composition that raises questions: why did the artist choose this moment, that vantage point? Rather than looking for self-evident truisms (this scene was worth depicting because it is beautiful, for example), I sought out artworks that asked me to find unexpected delight in the ordinary.

By design, juried, open call exhibitions lack curatorial focus. However, I can still speak to select themes I noticed among the submissions. I am struck by the relatively small number of artworks featuring human figures. There were far more animals, landscapes both urban and rural, and abstract explorations of color, light, and form. In an era when climate change and environmental degradation are among the most pressing issues we face, it comes as little surprise that we see artists turning their focus to the oft-neglected worlds and species beyond the human sphere. Spurred on by these innovative artistic visions, I was heartened and inspired to consider the inner lives of species other than my own, or the happenings in spaces I don't inhabit. This is what good art does: it asks us to imagine and see beyond the limits of our own experience. I offer my congratulations to all those accepted to the SPCARTS 27th Annual Exhibition, and my thanks to everyone who submitted.
